WAXAXE ear wax removal service is governed by the following terms and conditions:

The micro suction wax removal procedure is carried out by a trained clinician working to the standards set out by BSHAA (British Society of Hearing Aid Audiologists). Complications are extremely uncommon; however possible complications, side effects and material risks include: incomplete removal of ear wax requiring a return visit (for severely impacted wax), minor bleeding, discomfort, ringing in the ear (tinnitus), perforation of the ear drum and hearing loss.

We ask the client to answer, accurately, medical questions for full disclosure. In addition, it is important that the patient remains still during the procedure.

There may be cases where the micro suction does not remove the wax; the wax may be soft and spread across the ear drum or too hard and compacted. Irrigation is a wax removal method that uses pulsating warm water and may be offered as an alternative method. The practitioner will ensure this is safe for the client and will explain the procedure before consent.
